Another serious problem is the fact that during the end of 2010 troop contributors had decided for reasons of internal security to withdraw one of the biggest assets of the mission, its attack helicopters along with some of its transport helicopters. This has had a massive adverse impact on the reaction capacity of the mission, affecting its ability to fulfill its mandate in terms of the protection of civilians as well as other aspects of the mission.
