Some members of the FNL rebellion have returned to the bush, while their leader Agathon Rwaswa is often reported to be in the eastern Congo. Burundian government officials accused the Congolese of complicity in FNL and MSD crossings into the Congo. Relations between Congo and Burundi have been somewhat strained due to this, as well as the fact that President Kabila still has connections to a dissident faction of the ruling CNDD-FDD led by Hussein Rajabu, who is in jail in Bujumbura. Kabila did not attend Nkurunziza's inauguration and Burundi was one of the countries named in the recent UN mapping report for human rights abuses.
